Guernsey has its own currency but sterling is accepted in the Channel Islands. Some places accept Euros. A bureau de change is available at the Guernsey Information Centre. Thomas Cook in St Peter Port, Condor Ferries at the harbour terminal and most High Street banks, during normal opening hours.


